## Staff Understanding

- This proposal would add a criteria item to 6.5.8.1 (Initial Assignment Criteria).
  - Because each of the existing criteria items in that section can independently qualify an organization for IPv6 address space from ARIN, this new criteria item adds an additional qualification criteria. It makes it easier for some organizations to qualify, and does not make it more difficult for anyone.
  - In particular, it creates a new criteria point that allows any end-user organization large enough to have 13 sites to immediately qualify for IPv6 address space from ARIN.



## Staff Comments

This policy can be implemented as written.



## Legal Assessment

Counsel sees no material legal issues in this policy.



## Implementation

- This policy would have minimal resource impact from an implementation aspect. It is estimated that implementation would occur within 3 months after ratification by the ARIN Board of Trustees. The following would be needed in order to implement:
