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IANA Numbering Services SLA



Overview

- The Service Level Agreement (SLA) for IANA Numbering Services is an agreement for provision of IANA registry services for the global number resource registries (i.e. the top-level IPv4, IPv6, ASN registries)
- SLA principles were specified in the CRISP team proposal for IANA Stewardship Transition
- SLA agreement will be between the IANA Numbering Services Operator and the 5 RIRs
- ICANN (having done an excellent job to date)
2 will be the IANA Numbering Services Operator

Background

- Drafting done by RIR legal staff, coordinating with CRISP team for reviews
- Public comment periods after each draft
- Drafting History
 - First draft: 1 May 2015
 - Second draft: 6 August 2015
 - Third draft: 30 October 2015
 - Fourth draft: 25 February 2016
 - Fifth draft: 18 March 2016
- Final version – *Today*

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Summary

- 5 year agreement, with automatic renewal
- Right to not renew (with 12 months notice)
- Right to terminate (for failure to perform)
- Obligations for best efforts and cooperation in transition to a successor operator
- Agreement to be signed in May/June timeframe
- Condition Precedent language so that the Agreement does not take effect until ICANN is released from its NTIA IANA
