Transfers for New Entrants

What does the Problem Statement mean?

- A new entrant ISP might not have a /24.
- Many if not most new entrants might fit this criterion.
- For both ISPs and end users minimum allocation size is now /24, so especially end users needing less than that might not be able to get that from PA space and so might need to get a /24 via transfer through ARIN. This is currently not permitted.
- This Recommended Draft Policy would permit this.

What does the Policy text regarding NRPM section 4.2.2 mean?

- Only concerns ISPs
- Retires 4.2.2.1 entirely including preamble and all subsections and places this text directly under 4.2.2
- I could spend a lot of time translating all the equivalencies between existing NRMP text and this text, but essentially this allows new entrant ISPs who do not have a /24 to get one via transfer and thus satisfy the requirement.

What does the Policy text regarding NRPM section 4.3.2 mean?

- Only concerns End Users
- Retires 4.3.2.1 entirely including preamble and all subsections and places this text directly under 4.3.2
- Again, lots of translations between existing text and this, essentially enables new entrant End Users who don't have (or need) a /24 to get one via transfer.

What does the Policy text regarding NRPM section 4.3.3 mean? Slide 1

- Replaces “Utilization rate of address space is a key factor in justifying a new assignment of IP address space. Requesters must show exactly how previous address assignments have been utilized and must provide appropriate details to verify their one-year growth projection.”
- with
- “Organizations may qualify for a larger initial allocation by providing appropriate details to verify their 24-month growth projection for specified transfers, or 12 months

What does the Policy text regarding NRPM section 4.3.3 mean? Slide 2



- Applies to both ISPs and End Users
- Allows for larger initial allocations via transfer and specifies the terms.

Comments on Comments



- 2016-2 normalizes all references to qualification time horizons in the PDP to 24 months. If 2016-2 gains consensus, the text in this RDP will also be updated accordingly.
