Over the past several years ARIN has invested in expanding its outreach to the Caribbean...and with good reason.

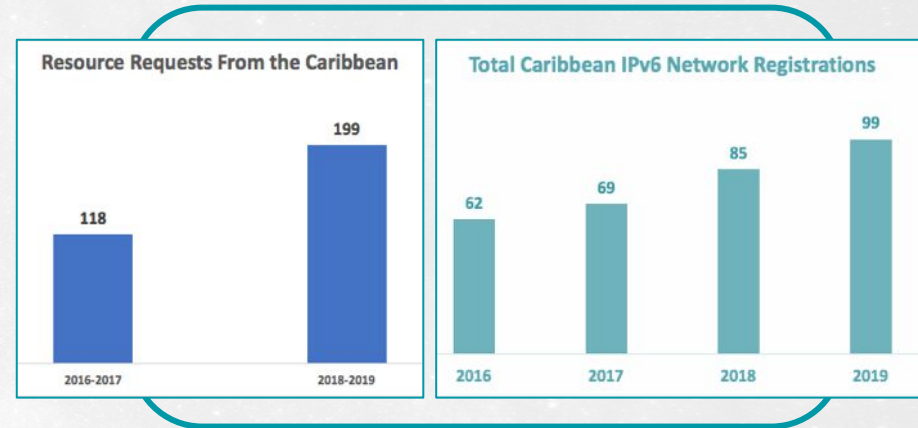
The Caribbean is home to 22 of the 29 territories in the ARIN Service Region.

The ARIN Caribbean Forum, established in 2018, brought **more direct points of contact with our stakeholders in the Caribbean**, facilitating:

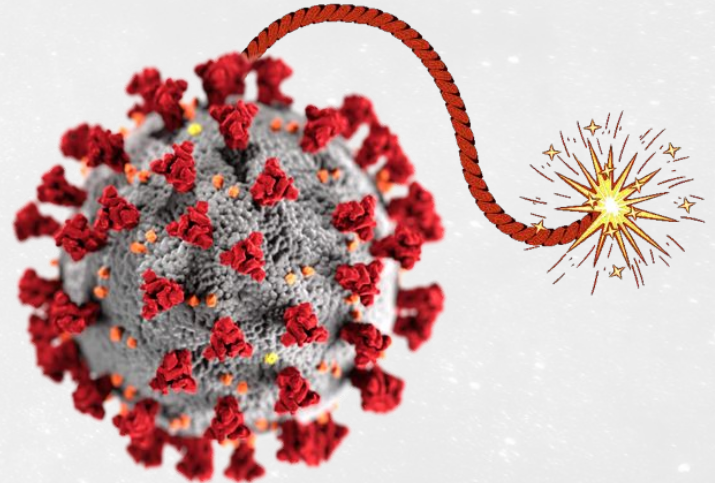
- ✓ tech community development;

Since 2018, we observed a rise in requests for Internet number resources and an increased adoption of IPv6 in the Caribbean

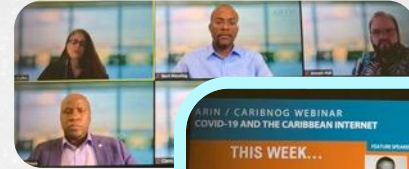
The COVID-19 Impact

Pandemic related lockdowns and public-health restrictions have led to an **unprecedented surge in demand for Internet Connectivity and reliance on the Internet for digital government, essential services and e-commerce** throughout the Caribbean.



OPPORTUNITY IN THE CRISIS

ARIN responded by providing a series of targeted virtual events, via the ARIN Caribbean Forum in collaboration with our partners in the region, such as the Caribbean Telecommunications Union (CTU), the Caribbean Network Operators Group (CaribNOG) and our sister iOrgs (LACNIC, ISOC, ICANN)



STRENGTHENING THE TECHNICAL COMMUNITY

The ARIN/CaribNOG webinar series, “**COVID-19 and the Caribbean Internet**,” explored the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on **infrastructure, security, access policy, network service delivery.**

The series comprised of 10 weekly sessions, conducted from 9 April to 12 June 2020



FACILITATING INTERNET PUBLIC POLICY DEVELOPMENT

The ARIN/CTU webinar series comprised of 4 weekly sessions from 9 - 30 July 2020 under the theme “**Accelerating 21st Century Government in the Caribbean**”

Each webinar was designed to **sensitize** leaders and policy makers about global Internet trends, and their relevance to a safe, open and secure Internet.



OUR EVOLVING CARIBBEAN OUTREACH



ARIN is also supporting other regional initiatives

such as the Caribbean Internet Governance Forum (CIGF), Caribbean Peering and Interconnection Forum (CarPIF) and the CaribNOG regional meetings

We are also **strengthening our collaboration with intergovernmental organizations**, including CARICOM and the Organization for Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) and the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD)
