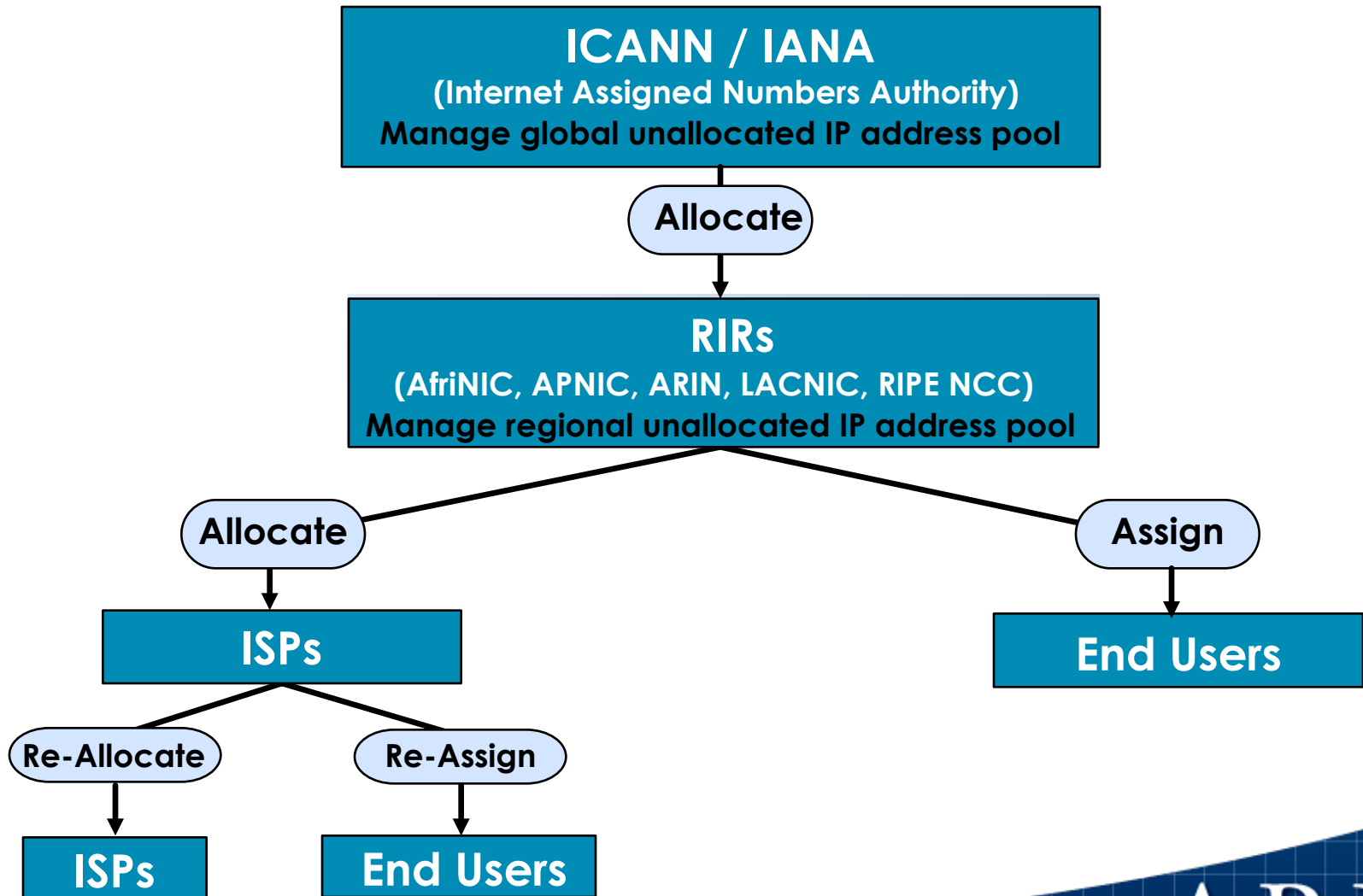
Regional Internet Registries

- The Regional Internet Registry (RIR) system began in 1992
- There are five RIRs
- All RIRs are nonprofit, community-driven organizations
- RIRs coordinate closely with IANA, and are part of the Internet Registry System

Internet Registry System

ICANN (IANA)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Top level coordination of the Internet identifiers (domain names, numbers)• Manage global unallocated IP address pool<ul style="list-style-type: none">– Allocate number resources to RIRs
RIR	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Manage regional unallocated IP address pool<ul style="list-style-type: none">– Allocate number resources to ISPs/LIRs– Assign number resources to End-users
ISP/LIR	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Manage local IP address pool for use by customers and for infrastructure<ul style="list-style-type: none">– Allocate number resources to ISPs– Assign number resources to End-users

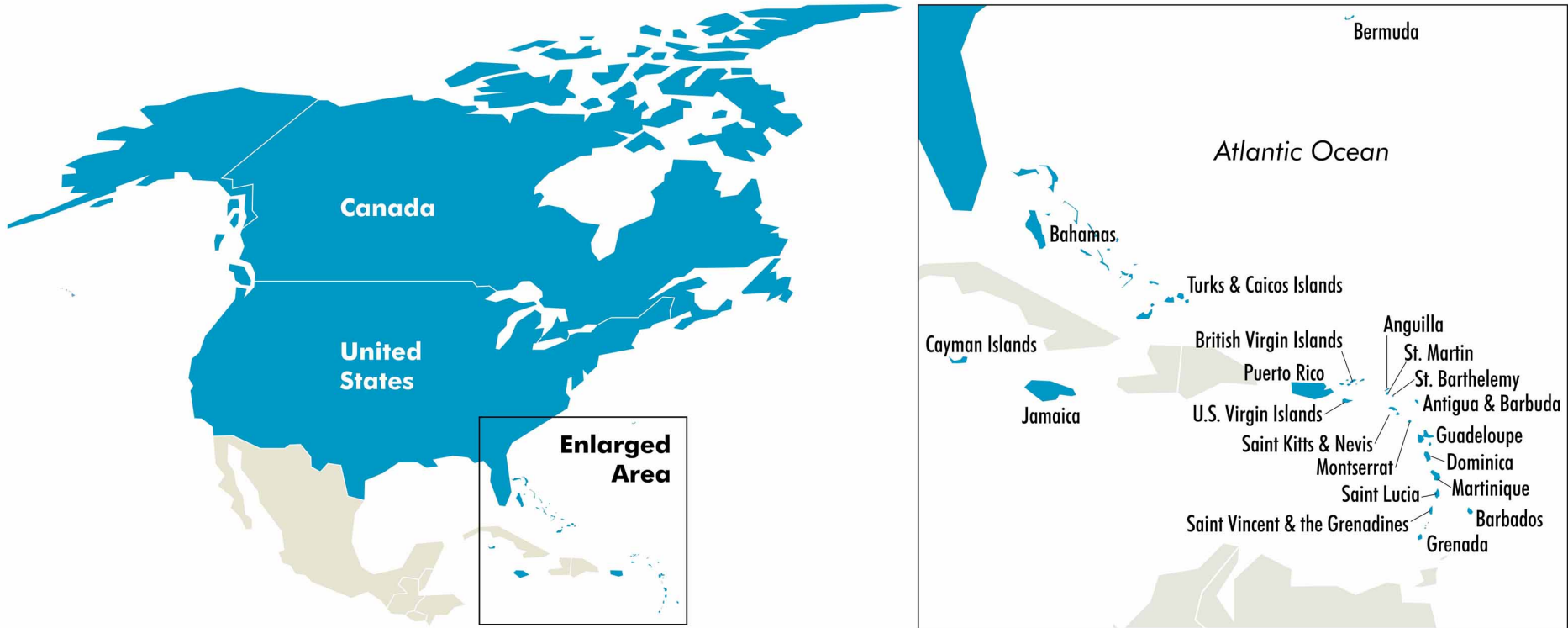

ARIN's region includes Canada, many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands, and the United States.

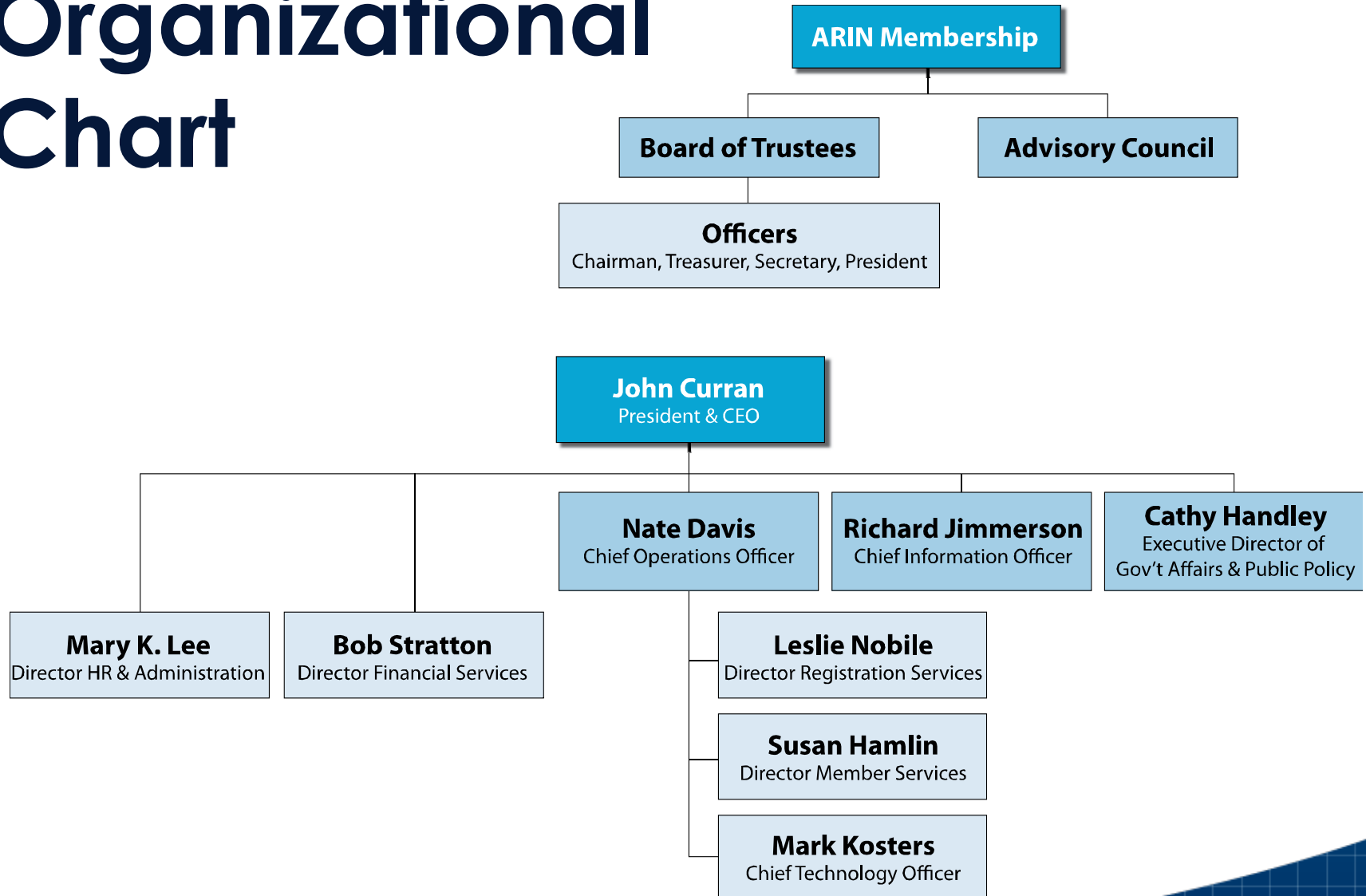
ARIN's Mission

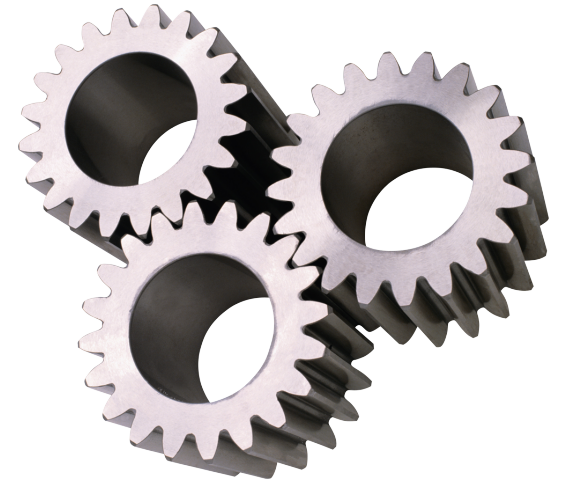

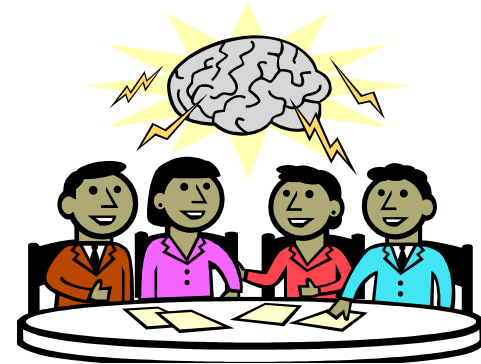
